Mr. Clark will be greatly missed by Mike who spent many hours crappie fishing with his Dad. They talked every day. Even though his Dad kept the deer camp so hot that he once caught his coat on fire, Mike loved the time spent with his Dad there.

He and Frances spent many hours on the square dance floor, and he liked to look nice. He would always ask her how his hair looked and if he looked ok. He was taking medication that would cause him to nod off in church, and Cindy, who sat between them, was always punching him to wake him up. Recently Bro. Wes told him from the pulpit that his sermon was going to be so short that he wouldn't have time for a nap.

His legacy of love for his family and God was displayed every night as he prayed for God to protect Allie.

Mr. Glen Clark is survived by his wife, Frances, of Oxford; his son Mike (Cindy) Clark of Oxford; one brother, Buster (Elaine); and a host of nieces, nephews, and great nieces and great nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, Delmar and Flo Clark and five brothers, Billy Clark, Sammy Clark, Charlie Clark, James Clark, and Bobby Clark.
